COURSE OVERVIEW

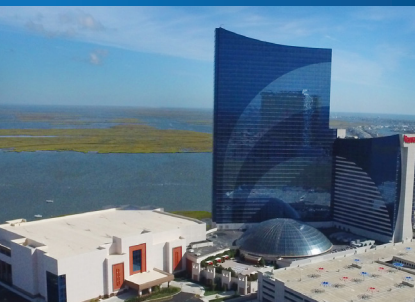
