

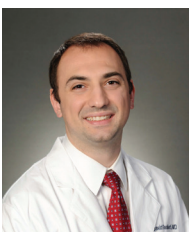

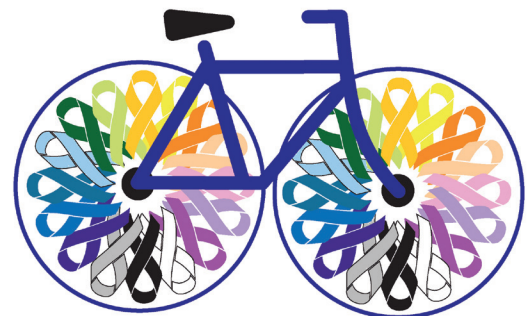

ADVANCED RADIATION TREATMENT FOR ATLANTICARE PATIENTS

More than 50% of all cancer patients will require radiation therapy during their course of treatment. Radiation therapy may be used to destroy or shrink tumors, sometimes before or after cancer surgery, and to help alleviate symptoms. Each patient's needs are different.

At the AtlantiCare Cancer Care Institute, a Fox Chase Cancer Center Partner, we offer the latest, safest and most effective radiation therapies to treat a wide range of cancers. Treatment is tailored for you – your specific type and location of cancer, your general health, and other current treatments are considered when caring for you. This specialized care is possible because we employ a variety of cutting-edge technology and advanced procedures. These include:

Accuray CyberKnife®

This robotic stereotactic radiosurgery system offers a painless, nonsurgical option for patients who have inoperable or surgically complex tumors. Using image guidance and computer-controlled robotics, CyberKnife delivers multiple beams of high-energy radiation to tumors from virtually any direction with ultra-precision. The CyberKnife system tracks a tumor's position, detects any tumor or patient movement and automatically corrects the treatment delivery. Because it can treat tumors anywhere in the body with sub-millimeter accuracy, higher doses of radiation can be used, increasing the chance of successful treatment.

Varian TrueBeam 2.7 and Trilogy Linear Accelerators

Our state-of-the-art linear accelerators deliver radiation to the tumor with pinpoint precision, minimizing damage to surrounding healthy tissue. Treatment options include:

Intensity-modulated radiation therapy (IMRT):

Delivers treatment precisely around the tumor by controlling the intensity of the radiation beams. This allows higher radiation doses to be focused within the tumor while reducing the exposure to surrounding normal critical structures.

RapidArc®: The fastest way to deliver radiation to the treatment area, using arc rotations around the patient.

Image-guided radiation therapy (IGRT): Uses imaging techniques during radiation treatment to visualize the tumor and more accurately deliver the radiation.

Optical surface monitoring system (OSMS):

The newest image-guided technique available on the TrueBeam linear accelerators. This 3D imaging technology monitors the surface of the patient's body to ensure more accurate delivery of radiation.

High-dose rate (HDR) brachytherapy: Delivers radiation treatment by placing radioactive seeds near or inside the tumor.

Systemic radiation therapy:

Uses radiopharmaceuticals to therapeutically treat cancer or help alleviate symptoms. AtlantiCare offers the following therapies:

- Iodine-131 — used to treat thyroid illnesses
- Xofigo Radium-223 — used to treat prostate cancer that has spread to bone

AtlantiCare has earned full accreditation from the American College of Radiology (ACR), which means we meet the highest standards in patient safety and care.

Our board-certified radiation oncologists and technicians will work closely with you and your cancer care team to carefully plan and monitor each treatment to maximize success. We'll also be right by your side through every phase of treatment to help you feel well and minimize changes to your normal routine.



HEMATOLOGY/MEDICAL ONCOLOGY SERVICES

A diagnosis of cancer can feel overwhelming. But at the AtlantiCare Cancer Care Institute, we offer a full range of advanced treatments and therapies to help you face it head-on.

Our dedicated cancer care team of hematologists/medical oncologists is committed to providing you with high-quality, compassionate care by working closely with other experts including radiation oncologists, surgeons, pathologists, radiologists, geneticist, nurse practitioners, and more. Together, they will create a treatment plan tailored to your unique needs, which may include some of the newest therapeutic options available. You may also qualify for a leading-edge clinical trial, available right here in South Jersey. Expert cancer care and coordination are provided by our oncology-certified nurses, nurse navigators, social workers, dietician and financial counselor.

Full Range of Cancer Treatments

As part of your personalized care plan, your hematologist/medical oncologist will help choose the optimal treatment or combination therapies for your specific cancer. These include:

Chemotherapy: Drugs that target cells that grow and divide quickly, such as cancer cells. It works throughout your body so it can also affect some other fast-growing healthy cells as well, such as those of the hair and skin, which may cause some side effects.

Immunotherapy: Utilizes the body's natural immune system to kill cancer cells. These drugs help normal immune cells to recognize cancer cells and destroy them.

Targeted therapy: Helps stop cancer from growing and spreading by targeting specific genes or proteins found in cancer cells or blood vessel cells.

Hormone therapy: Slows or stops cancer cells that use hormones to grow.



Hematologic Treatments:

For patients with hematologic conditions, our hematologists/oncologists provide the same level of care and attention in conjunction with the following services:

- Iron infusion therapy
- Blood and blood product transfusion
- Therapeutic phlebotomy

You and the care team will carefully plan and monitor each treatment to maximize success. We will be right by your side through every phase of treatment.

ORAL ONCOLOGY SPECIALTY PHARMACY PROGRAM

An Oral Oncology Specialty Pharmacy Program was implemented at the AtlantiCare Cancer Care Institute in 2021. The primary goal of the program is to remove common patient barriers such as insurance prior authorizations and exceptionally high patient copays, which delay or prevent recommended treatment with oral oncology medications, as well as obtaining medications for uninsured and underinsured patients. This new program focuses on increasing quality of life related to adverse reactions, maximizing patient adherence and reducing healthcare costs (ER visits, Urgent Care visits) by providing proactive care for patients instead of reactive care. Pharmacist-directed intervention strategies, along with patient education and patient monitoring, can help patients remain on their medications and prevent or reduce adverse reactions associated with oral oncolytics.

Patient adherence is critical for optimizing outcomes.

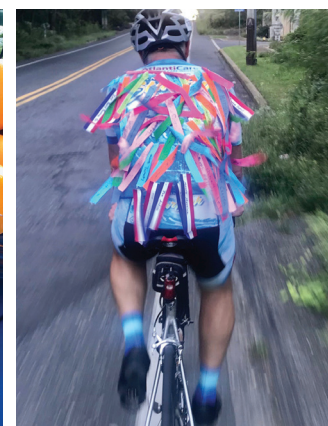
Poor adherence can lead to decreased efficacy and treatment failures. Ongoing patient adherence is performed by the Specialty Pharmacy Technician, who calls the patient prior to delivery of the medication refill to confirm that the patient is ready for their next refill. The Pharmacy Technician confirms that the medication or dosage has not changed since their last fill and inquires if the patient has missed any doses, and, if so, how many. Compliance issues or concerns are conveyed to the patient's provider.

A proactive approach to adverse reaction management can:

- Increase patient communications
- Decrease severe symptoms
- Increase quality of life
- Increase adherence
- Decrease dosage reductions
- Decrease ER & Urgent Care visits
- Increase positive outcomes



All of these can help lead to increased survival time.



CANCER GENETICS CLINIC AT ATLANTICARE

The Cancer Genetics Clinic at AtlantiCare provides an opportunity for patients with concerns for a possible hereditary cancer risk in their family to meet with a board-certified and licensed genetic counselor to receive a personalized cancer genetic risk assessment. Genetic counselors are specifically trained to help patients understand the complexities of cancer genetics and guide patients through the genetic testing process. **We offer testing, provide counseling, and guide patients in their next steps.**

Licensed Genetic Counselor Amanda Schmader, MS, CGC, works with physicians and nurses to identify patients who may benefit from genetic testing and coordinate their care. Amanda is a member of the National Society of Genetic Counseling, including its Cancer Special Interest Group. She helps empower patients and their families with information, guidance, and emotional support to help them understand their family history, evaluate genetic testing options and **make informed choices based on test results.**

As AtlantiCare's genetic counselor, Schmader's goal is to make genetics personal and easy to understand. When patients come for a genetic counseling session, she reviews their personal history of cancer, draws out their family tree, and provides relevant information about genetic testing and inherited risk. She works with patients to choose the right genetic test for them and, if they wish, they can then provide a saliva sample for testing right in her office. When results come back, she follows-up with patients to explain what the results mean in practical terms, and works with their providers to ensure they receive the care they need.

Genetic testing and counseling is an integral part of patient care and we are proud to offer this tool to help our patients make informed healthcare decisions.

ADVANCING CANCER CARE THROUGH CLINICAL RESEARCH

Clinical trials (research studies) help medical researchers understand more about cancer and its treatment. AtlantiCare Cancer Care Institute is proud to offer patients the chance to take part in clinical trials that test new ways to diagnose and/or treat cancer and new ways to improve the lives of those with cancer. These studies are conducted by some of the country's most prominent medical research organizations and we feel honored to be able to offer them to you right here in South Jersey.

Almost everything we know about how to diagnose and treat cancer today was learned through the participation of people just like you. People take part in clinical trials for many reasons, including gaining access to new treatments that are not yet widely available and wanting to make a difference for others who will be diagnosed with cancer in the future.

Your provider will discuss whether a clinical trial is available to you. Enrolling is your choice. You may choose to take part or not and are free to leave at any time.

The AtlantiCare Oncology Clinical Research Manager helps patients understand what clinical trials may be available for them and their type of cancer. Research nurses explain everything patients need to know to make an informed decision about whether or not to take part.

Your Oncology Social Worker will help you with the following:

- Counseling for you and your family
- Understanding your cancer diagnosis and ways to cope
- Identifying ways to manage your diagnosis and emotional effects of treatment
- Coordinating with your cancer treatment team members
- Teaching you about talking to your children, family, friends or coworkers about your diagnosis
- Teaching stress reducing and relaxation techniques
- Completing your disability and other healthcare related forms
- Understanding the effects cancer has on sex, intimacy, fertility and your body image
- Referrals to financial counseling, clinical trials, a patient navigator, dietitian, and/or pastoral care and community resources
- Providing education on advance directives, survivorship and support services

BENEFITS OF GOOD NUTRITION FOR CANCER TREATMENT

When your body is fighting cancer, proper nourishment is important to your well-being and quality of life before, during and after treatment. At the AtlantiCare Cancer Care Institute, all patients have the opportunity to meet with a registered dietitian to discuss their nutritional status and needs.

The nutrient needs of people with cancer vary from person to person. A registered dietitian can help you identify your nutrition-related goals and plan ways to help you achieve them. Eating well while you're being treated for cancer may help you:

- Feel better
- Keep up your strength and energy
- Maintain your weight
- Maintain your body's nutrient stores (muscle mass, fat mass, storage of vitamins, minerals)
- Better tolerate treatment-related side effects
- Heal and recover faster

HOW A NURSE NAVIGATOR CAN ASSIST YOU

- Coordinate care with the multidisciplinary oncology team
- Keep all providers updated about patients on a regular basis
- Educate the patient and family about cancer, treatments, clinical trials and support services
- Educate the patient and family on symptoms that should be reported to the physician
- Assess the needs of the patient and family that would interfere with cancer treatment (e.g. transportation or financial concerns)
- Connect the patient with necessary resources and support services during treatment (e.g. social worker or dietitian)
- Share with the patient and family community agencies and national resources
- Provide continuity of support while moving from one aspect (diagnosis) of the cancer experience to others (treatment, survivorship, etc.)

TAKING CARE AND GIVING BACK

In addition to specialized medical services for the diagnosis and treatment of cancer, community education and outreach are important elements of the service continuum at AtlantiCare Cancer Care Institute.
